

We oppose slavery and human trafficking in all its forms. This statement sets out the steps we take to mitigate the risk that there is slavery or human trafficking in our business or in our supply chains.

About us

We are an owner-managed group of companies in the financial services sector.

Although we are not required to make a modern slavery statement under section 54 of the UK's Modern Slavery Act 2015, we are making this voluntary statement to show our commitment to ethical trading principles and to set out the steps we are taking to identify and address the risk of tackle modern slavery and human trafficking in our business and in our supply chains.

Our supply chains mainly consist of the following: professional or financial services firms, local service sector business which are known to the business and which are subject to stringent work permit requirements, and large UK/international companies which are subject to statutory anti-modern slavery obligations.

Policies

Our Anti-slavery and Human Trafficking Policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to help ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains.

Due Diligence and Risk Assessment

To help identify and monitor the risk of slavery and human trafficking in our supply chain we have policies and procedures in place to help ensure that suppliers and sub-contractors are committed to ethical labour practices.
